

Gala Quilt Guild, September 17, 2022

Linda Walker, our president, introduced herself and opened the meeting. Twenty-eight people attended the meeting. Eight people had participated in the workshop. This workshop was a mystery Christmas table runner that Juanita Christian had run. Several people showed their Christmas table top that they had made in the morning workshop. These were very nice. Eight people had participated in the workshop. About 8 others worked on the one yard bags.

In October the workshop will be on Seminole piecing. Twenty-two people had signed up. Linda Walker and Frances Thomason will conduct the workshop.

Those who remembered to bring their first quilts showed them. These were interesting to see and hear stories about. The program was on documenting quilts. Juanita told about taking a picture, the pattern, and fabric samples and putting them in a sleeve. Juanita encouraged everyone to document their quilts in some kind of way.

Linda talked about the charity project. Fifty-five quilts have been completed. She passed out various quilts that are partially completed and asked people to complete a backing, quilting, or binding.

On Saturday, October 29, 2022, the Fort Mitchell festival will take place. A sales table will be set up and various handmade items will be sold. Three quilts will be raffled off. Tickets will be \$1.00 or 6 for \$5.00. Volunteers were needed for manning the booth. Members were encouraged to make items to sell. All items made need to be brought to the October meeting.

In November there will be a sit and sew. Kim Scarboro will be doing a program on Kitchen Sink quilts. In December there will be the brown bag exchange and a pot luck lunch. There was discussion about possibly making a guild trip to a quilt show.

There was drawings for prizes. Rebecca explained the new block of the month. Rebecca asked for q-tips, sanitary items, hair brushes and combs. Wash cloths,

hand towels, socks, underwear, flip flops, razors, shave cream and any other items that may help.
